JOB DESCRIPTION

We are seeking an enthusiastic Consultant Psychiatrist looking for a new challenge. To be eligible, candidates must have full GMC registration with current license to practice and have either gained CCT in General Adult or Forensic Psychiatry, or be within Higher Psychiatry Training (ST4-6).

Ideal candidates would have experience of a community adult setting involving face-to-face and video consultations and be approved under section 12(2) of the MHA (2006).

THE ROLE

As a Royal Air Force Consultant Psychiatrist you will work 10 PA in established posts within MoD Departments of Community Mental Health, providing occupational general adult psychiatric care including risk management and liaison, to service personnel. Working within a multidisciplinary team you will provide and develop clinical leadership and management with responsibility for clinical governance and healthcare assurance.

In addition, Royal Air Force Consultant Psychiatrists are provided training in military aviation medicine and contribute to the provision of occupational mental healthcare provision to

aircrew and air traffic controllers. There is the opportunity to develop with career progression in other leadership roles within the Defence Medical Services.



Trauma & Orthopaedic Consultant

JOB DESCRIPTION

We are seeking a motivated individual looking for a new challenge. The individual must have a CCT in Trauma and Orthopaedics, be in a substantive post (or have an offer of a substantive post). They should be registered with the GMC and be on the specialist register. Ideally, they should work in a Major Trauma Centre (MTC) or busy Trauma Unit (TU), have completed or be willing to complete trauma surgery fellowship and can demonstrate they have aptitude for military service.

The individual should partake in a generic T&O on call and regular generic trauma lists and can demonstrate engagement with appraisal and revalidation. They should have a sub-speciality interest that is commensurate with military service, with an interest in general adult trauma. Finally, the individual should be up-to-date DBS and able to demonstrate an appropriate CV and employment history with no issues or probity or clinical malpractice pending.

THE ROLE

As a Royal Air Force orthopaedic surgeon you will work in the UK alongside NHS colleagues to maintain and develop your specialist expertise while providing advice and support to military healthcare teams in looking after the specialist needs of the Royal Air Force, requiring an interest in the flight environment. You will train for and deploy on operations worldwide, with Royal Air Force and other military hospital teams, providing high quality healthcare in diverse and challenging circumstances. Here you will need a different skill and mindset to the UK, with a very different environment and setting.

On top of a competitive salary, consistent support and exceptional training, we offer a structured and progressive career path designed to encourage and reward excellence. The RAF is a strong advocate of continuous professional development; this will include various types of on-going professional training to your continued registration with

the General Medical Council (GMC). RESIDENCY AND NATIONALITY REQUIREMENTS

You must be a citizen of the United Kingdom or the Republic of Ireland, holder of dual UK/other nationality or have been a Commonwealth citizen since birth. Whether

or not you were born in the United Kingdom, you should have resided there for the 5 years immediately preceding your application, but candidates with a minimum of 3 years will be considered.
